Lee Bul: From 1998 to Now

The Special Exhibition at M+ features more than 200 works from the artist's studio as well as institutional and private collections across Asia and beyond. The M+ presentation includes an extra forty-nine pieces of the artist's early works from the late 1990s to early 2000s, as well as pieces created in 2024. The exhibition gives audiences a rare opportunity to trace the pivotal developments in Lee's groundbreaking practice from the late 1990s to the present, situating her work within both regional and global contexts.

'Luminous Neon' Exhibition

The exhibition features restored iconic signs, including those from Golden Phoenix Grill Restaurant, Tai Ping Koon, Nam Cheong Pawn Shop, and Da Cheong Computer Optical Centre. In collaboration with Tetra Neon Exchange, the exhibition creates a dialogue between eras, casting Hong Kong's neon heritage as a radiant continuum that illuminates the city's design legacy, craftsmanship and evolving creative spirit.

Ryuichi Sakamoto | Seeing Sound, Hearing Time

Celebrates the legacy of Japanese composer, producer and artist Ryuichi Sakamoto (1952–2023). The work is part of a series of 'installation music', in which the album is paired with a three-dimensional representation of the music in a gallery space. Shown as a site-specific installation in The Studio, the work features artist Takatani's visual compositions of Sakamoto's instruments, plants, books and other object from his studio, projected onto a large LED screen.

DeePle The People

DeePle The People is a new artwork by leading digital artist DeeKay Kwon, who creates art about humanity: indeed, 'DeePle = DeeKay + People'. With this new animation, DeeKay turns his eye to Hong Kong, rendering the Asian metropolis in his signature style characterized by nostalgic video game aesthetics and joyful tenderness.

Art Central 2026

Art Central returns to Hong Kong's iconic Central Harbourfront for its eleventh edition, featuring a diverse range of emerging and established artists represented by pioneering galleries from Hong Kong, Asia, and beyond. Staged in an architectural masterpiece overlooking Victoria Harbour, the fair showcases over 100 galleries and features 500 artists. It includes a 5-day programme of performances, installations, video art and talks, all complemented by exceptional dining. Taking place annually in March, Art Central is an art fair in Hong Kong that offers collectors, industry professionals and art lovers a distinguished platform to explore forward-thinking contemporary art and foster meaningful cultural connections.

Art Basel Hong Kong 2026
