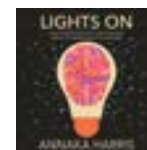
Listen Closely

As the global podcast market continues to grow, adding an estimated \$33 billion to its market cap by the end of the decade, there is a shift away from lengthy, loosely structured talk shows toward tightly produced, story-driven audio docuseries. Usually told in fewer than a dozen

episodes, these are deep dives into a single subject, company, scandal, or scientific controversy.

Episodes are constructed like a limited TV series or documentary. Publishers, especially in Europe, are pushing these high-end productions to attract subscriptions. The subscription audio

product launched last year by the German new paper *Die Zeit* is mostly driven by exclusive documentaries and miniseries, with the first few episodes typically free before a cliffhanger moment triggers a paywall. Here are *Briefings's* picks for audio series that pack a big reward for a modest time investment. ▀

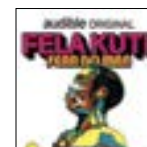
